For the children, we introduced an Easter fun day (see poster) and later in the year another Buglab experience. New and existing activities designed to raise nature awareness to youngsters.

For the adults, there was the Spring walk.

Calendar fixtures such as the AGM enabled us to learn about bees courtesy of local beekeeper, Caroline Luxford. The Canal Festival gave us the opportunity to interact with visitors and promote our cause. Whilst the local Xmas Tree Festival was a successful event that raised over £3.000 in aid of fund raising for All Saints Church.

To increases funds an application to 'Tesco Bags for Projects' has been put in place by Malcolm and other sources are being considered via 'Waitrose Community Project Scheme' and possible the 'Aviva Community Fund'.

Also we will be applying again for the Green Flag Award, Britain in Bloom - woodlands, and Natural Reserve status. These applications are in the hands of Steve Halton, John Creasey and Rosie Palmer - our thanks go out to them.

We intend to arrange Community Engagement activities, such as:

- Spring Walk bluebells,* Easter
- Easter children's nature wall*
- Bat walk*
- Canal Festival* (last Saturday of July)
- Xmas Tree Festival St Barnabas for 2018*

*All the above community engagement activities need to be discussed and planned.
